## PURPOSE OF SPOOKY-REE

The purpose of the Atlanta Area Council Cub Scout Spooky-REE program is to strengthen families through Scouting. The Spooky-REE experience provides a fun outdoor weekend camp experience for Cub Scouts and their Family. Family camping offers parents a great chance to share quality time with their children. Camp is a place for parents to let down their hair and become one of the gang. Making camp, building fires, cooking meals, cleanup and all related camping tasks become shared experiences. This shared living in camp strengthens the family. If it is good for the kids, it is good for the parents. If it is fun for them, it will be fun for the parents too. Family camp may be the first camping experience for many participants. It provides an environment for parents to introduce themselves and/or their children to the tent camping experience and the Council organized camp experience. Parents and children gain confidence that the Cub Scout can camp at future Council organized events with their unit. Although activities at Spooky-REE do count towards advancement for the Cub Scout, the primary focus of the camp is fun in the outdoors for all participants.

## PLANNING INFORMATION

### WHO CAN ATTEND?

Spooky-REE is open to all Cub Scouts and their families. Scout BSA Youth and Scout BSA Troops can volunteer to help at this event.

### SUPERVISORY RATIO

Each family group must be led by an adult (18 years or older) related to the registered Scout. Cub Scouts cannot camp without an adult relation, except for Webelos/Arrow of Light, who require two deep leadership. Note: For the remainder of this guide, wherever the term "parent" is used, this refers to the adult relative supervising the registered Scout.

Meal time is open seating. Feel Free to sit wherever there is an open seat.

#### Hand washing:

Hand washing stations are placed outside at each serving entrance to the dining hall. Adult leaders should coach their Scouts to wash their hands at these stations before they enter the dining hall.

#### A Scout is Clean:

After the meal please do the do the following:

1. Wipe off tables.
2. Sweep underneath tables and mop as necessary.
3. Return the plastic plates, glasses, and metal utensils in their appropriate dirty location.

### Online Class Scheduling (Fast Pass)

This year, we are offering a Fast Pass option for limited activities. To obtain a Fast Pass, each unit should pre-register online, beginning August 5th at 9 am, for assigned time slots for the following activities: BB Guns, Archery, Robotics (Ozobots) and Cub Mobile Racing. This Fast Pass locks in your time slot and ensures your wait time will be as short as possible. Fast Pass scheduling should be completed for the entire unit at one time. It is recommended that each unit discuss the available options, and then decide as a group on a schedule based upon their interests. All shooting sports require a mandatory safety briefing as a pre-requisite to shooting, which will be held at 7:00 pm on Friday and then every 30-minutes throughout the day on Saturday. For those units that do not pre-register for a Fast Pass, limited space will be available throughout the day, but may result in longer wait times.

It is very important that you prepare in advance for your class scheduling. The online module is a “real-time” system, and you will get the most out of it by completing your Packs entire schedule at one time. Be sure to have a program session at a meeting to discuss the available classes, then have them decide on a schedule based on their interests.

Do not fear, if the registration is full, there will be space allotted to those who did not get signed up early.

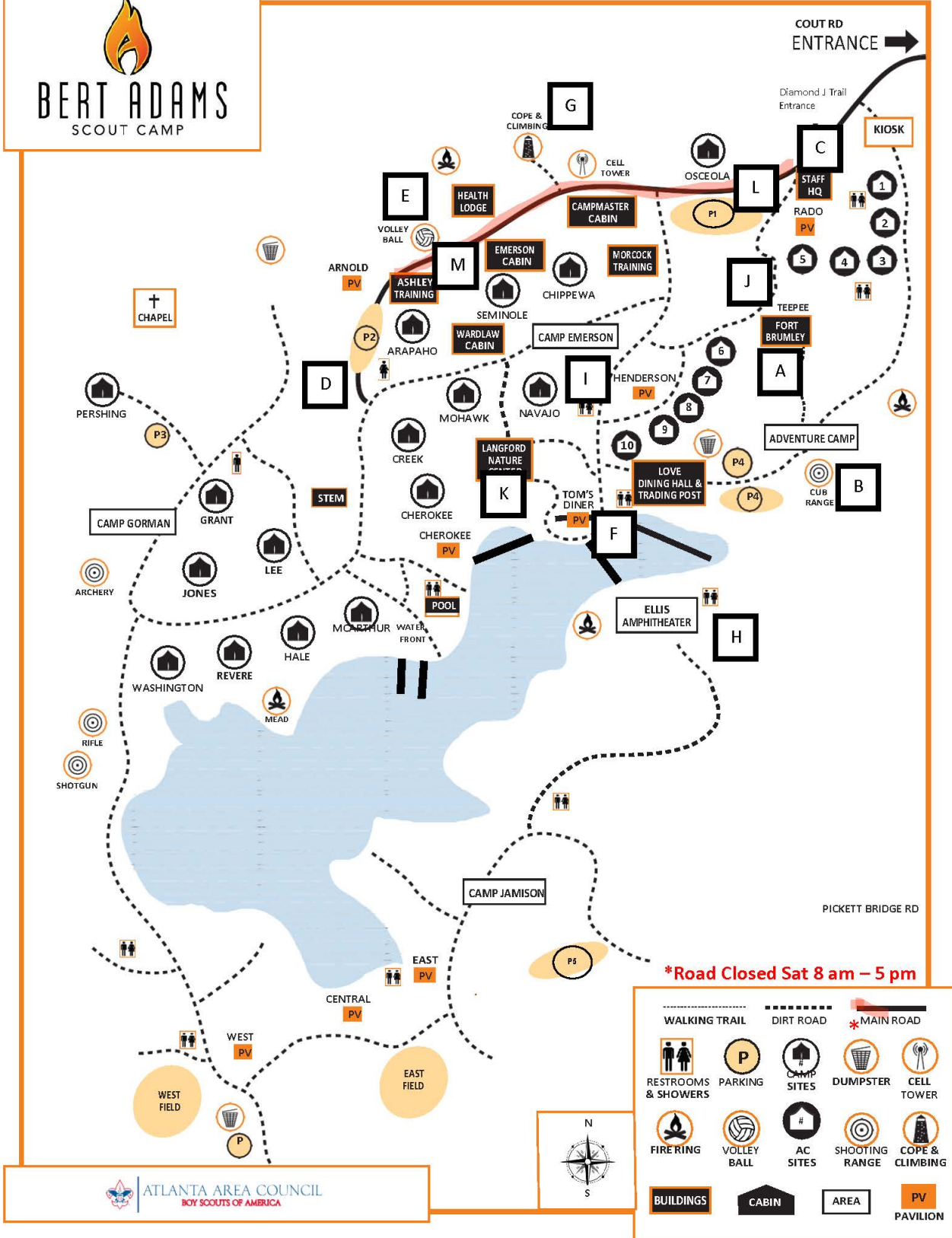

The Main road from Staff Headquarters to the Ashley Training Center will be closed to traffic from 8:00 am – 5:00 pm for the safety of our participants.





## Games and FUN

There are activities designed just for FUN in the outdoors whether you do them as a Pack, as a Den, or just with a buddy. Many will be open free time activities.

### Pumpkins:

You will receive a pumpkin for every paid youth participant. All children may decorate their pumpkins (carving only for 3rd grade or above children). Please bring your own supplies for decoration and/or carving; carving supplies should be child-safe saws and tools only and you will carve in your campsite. We will provide markers for decorating. Limited carving supplies may be available in the Camp Trading Post, open on Saturday.

### Trick-or-Treating:

As part of the Saturday night activities Trick-or-Treating party will be available for all youth and they are encouraged to bring a costume to wear. Every Pack is asked to set-up a Trick-or-Treating station with the candy and decorations. **Please do not bring candy that contains peanuts.** Please bring 10-15 pieces per youth your unit/family is bringing. This event is what you make it! Get in the spirit of the event by creating a spooky habitat. Please email [bertadams@atlantabsa.org](mailto:bertadams@atlantabsa.org) if you will be setting up a table as we will be making table assignments to allow for easy traffic flow. Prizes are available for the best booth! If you would like to use lights at your station, we will be able to provide access to electricity, but we need to know in advance. Station locations are first emailed first choice. Please plan on beginning set up after dinner so we are ready for the spooky event at 8PM!

## ARRIVAL AND CHECK-IN

Families may begin arriving at 5:00pm on Friday. Campsites assignments will be emailed the Wednesday before your weekend. There will be limited parking spaces in the Emerson, Gorman, Roosevelt, and Adventure Camp lots and are available on a first come basis. Once you arrive at camp, you will receive a parking pass. Drop off your gear at your campsite and move your car to the parking lot corresponding with your pass.

Please choose 1 person from your Pack to check-in for all families that are attending. This person will confirm number of participants, turn in a roster (REQUIRED- See Appendix A), and collect all meal tickets (**Individuals may pick up Friday meal tickets at the Camp Staff HQ**), t-shirts, and patches.

This Check-In will be done in the Camp Staff HQ next to the Emerson Lot for those that are arriving on Friday, and in the Camp Office for those arriving on Saturday.

Medical forms need to be brought to camp and held by your Pack for each person at camp with you, this includes all adults and siblings. They will be brought to the Health Lodge should someone need attention. A copy of the health form is available at [www.AtlantaBSA.org/Spookyree](http://www.AtlantaBSA.org/Spookyree)

### Saturday Arrivals:

All vehicle travel throughout camp will be strictly limited from 7am-6pm with **NO Vehicles will be allowed to travel through Camp from 8:00 am - 5:30pm on Saturday for the Safety of our youth.** Any families that arrive on Saturday must park in the Jamison lot. They may either hike gear in to the camp or drive in a vehicle after 5:30pm to their campsite to unload and then move to their designated lot.



## PARKING

If arriving on Friday night or on Saturday before 8:00 am: Limited parking spaces in the Emerson, Gorman, Roosevelt, and Adventure Camp lots will be available on a first come basis. Once you arrive at camp, you will receive a parking pass if available. Drop off your gear at your campsite and move your car to the parking lot corresponding with your pass. **You may not leave vehicles parked at the campsite.** If parking is not available at any of these lots, you will need to drop off your gear at the Emerson lot, park at Jamison and take a shuttle back to the Emerson lot. A staff vehicle will drive your gear to your campsite. If you need an ADA accessible parking spot, please contact Veronica Bramlett [Veronica.Bramlett@scouting.org](mailto:Veronica.Bramlett@scouting.org).

If arriving on Saturday between 8:00 am and 5:30: Drop off your gear at the Emerson lot, park at Jamison and take a shuttle back to the Emerson lot. A staff vehicle will drive your gear to your campsite. If you need an ADA accessible parking spot, please contact Veronica Bramlett at [BertAdams@AtlantaBSA.org](mailto:BertAdams@AtlantaBSA.org)

**NO VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED TO TRAVEL THROUGH CAMP ON SATURDAY, FROM 8:00 AM TO 5:30 PM.**

**It is important that you share this information with your parents. Please do not leave vehicles parked at the campsite.** All vehicles must be moved to a designated parking lot after you unload your supplies. ***Please do not remain parked in the campsite over 15 minutes in order to allow others to unload their gear.***

### Vehicles in Camp

All vehicles parked on camp property must display a camp vehicle Parking pass that will allow camp management to contact the owner/operator in the event of an emergency or other need. These Parking passes will be issued at check-in. If an improperly parked vehicle interferes with the safe operation of camp, the owner will be notified. If the situation is not resolved in a reasonable time, the vehicle will be towed at the owner's risk and expense.

Vehicles are not allowed in campsites. Any exceptions must be authorized by the Camp Director. Parking is available in one of the approved parking lots. Scouts, adult leaders, and visitors are expected to park, walk, exercise, and enjoy the beauty of our camp.

### Speed Limits

The camp wide maximum speed limit is 12 mph; we suggest 3 mph when campers are present.

## REFUND POLICY

Spooky-Ree is a Rain or Shine Event; therefore, all refund request must be made in writing to [BertAdams@AtlantaBSA.org](mailto:BertAdams@AtlantaBSA.org). Refund requests will be considered based upon when written request was submitted using the following schedule.

30+ days prior to the event date will receive a full refund.

15-29 days prior to the event receive a refund of 50% of the fees paid.

14 days or less before an event will not receive a refund.



## GENERAL INFORMATION

### Youth Protection Guidelines

- **Two-Deep Leadership:** Two registered adult leaders or one registered adult leader and a parent of a participant Scout, one of whom must be 21 years of age or older, are required on trips and outings. The chartered organization is responsible for ensuring that sufficient leadership is provided for all activities.
- **No One-on-One Contact:** One-on-one contact between adults and youth members is not permitted. In situations that require a personal conference, such as a Scoutmaster conference, the meeting is to be conducted in view of the other adults and youth.
- **Respect of Privacy:** Adult leaders must respect the privacy of youth members in situations such as changing clothes and taking showers at camp and intrude only to the extent that health and safety requires. Adults must protect their own privacy in similar situations.
- **Separate Accommodations:** When camping, no youth is permitted to sleep in the tent of an adult other than their own parent or guardian. Camp has separate shower and latrine facilities for females, or if separate facilities are not available, times for male and female use are scheduled and posted.

#### Restroom Facilities:

Most of our restroom facilities are individual stalls and may be used by any age/gender. Those facilities that are not individual stalls will have signage for who should be allowed those facilities. We need your help to make sure the separate accommodations are maintained, and we will insure the proper signage is posted. Please make sure your youth and families are using the correct facilities to adhere to Youth Protection standards.

#### Cool Weather/Rain Camping:

This event is a Rain or Shine event. The Council follows the Guide to Safe Scouting for cold weather camping. Please come prepared with additional dry clothes and bedding in case the weather is cooler or wetter than you planned. *Wearing closed-toed shoes will help not only with the cool weather, but keep your feet safe from the environment, too.*

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#### Identification

Each camper, adult leader, and visitor must wear camp issued identification (wristband). Camp visitors will be issued identification bands when they arrive at camp. Staff will be identified by their Camp Staff Shirts.

#### Pets

All pets are to be left at home. Pets of any type are not permitted; including those brought by parents or visitors. Registered service animals are the only animals allowed; please email us if you have a service animal at [BertAdams@AtlantaBSA.org](mailto:BertAdams@AtlantaBSA.org)

#### Chemical Fuels Policy

For safety, knowledgeable adult supervision must be present when Scouts are involved in the use, handling, lighting, or storage of chemical fuels (liquids, jellies, or gas). Propane lanterns and stoves are allowed. All fuels must be stored in a locked container. No liquid fueled lanterns should be used in camping activities. No fuel, lanterns, stoves, or candles are to be used in or near tents and camp structures.



### **Uniform**

The BSA field uniform is worn for evening flag ceremonies, dinner, chapel, and campfires. Field uniform must always be worn with shirts buttoned up and tucked in. Pack approved activity uniforms are appropriate for the remainder of the day.

### **Smoking**

The Bert Adams Scout Camp is a tobacco-free facility. Adults with tobacco habits may only use tobacco in the secluded area fenced behind the dining hall. This includes the use of vapor e-cigarettes, cigars, or chewing tobacco. Use of tobacco in any other area will result in dismissal from the camp property.

### **Flammability Warning**

No tent material is completely fireproof. Tent material can burn when exposed to continued, intense heat or fire. The most important safeguard is to keep flames away from canvas materials. For this reason, the following safety precautions must be adhered to: Only flashlights and electric lanterns are permitted in tents.

### **Fishing**

The fish are biting at Bert Adams. Bring your fishing poles and tackle to have some fun. We do enforce a catch and release policy.

### **Trading Post**

Our trading post is exceptionally well-stocked to serve you. We have camp supplies, crafts, souvenirs, toiletries, and even uniforms. Don't leave camp without your t-shirt or cap. Plus, the trading post has your snacks, drinks, and ice cream.

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Beyond these ideals, the following rules are enforced at the Bert Adams Scout Reservation:

- Packs must always have two-deep leadership while at camp. No exceptions!
- All campers shall wear a wristband to identify themselves.
- All cars must be parked in the designated camp parking areas. Only specially authorized vehicles are allowed in campsites or on the roads.
- Shoes must always be worn at camp and must be completely closed.
- Throwing rocks is strictly forbidden.
- No running in camp. We ask adult and youth leaders to help keep camp safe.
- No flames, fires, or fuels of any kind are permitted inside tents.
- No personal skateboards, inline skates, or mountain boards are permitted.
- Personal firearms and bows are not permitted.
- No alcoholic beverages or illegal substances are allowed on camp property.
- All guests are required to immediately check-in at the camp office.
- No fireworks of any kind are permitted on camp property.
