Atlanta Area Council Scout Reservations Rules:

- Packs must always have **two-deep leadership** while at camp. No exceptions!
- All campers should wear a wristband to identify themselves.
- All cars must be parked in the **designated camp parking areas**.
- **Shoes** must always be worn at camp and must be closed toe shoes.
- Throwing rocks is strictly forbidden.
- No running in camp. We ask adult and youth leaders to help keep camp safe.
- **No** personal skateboards, inline skates, or mountain boards are permitted.
- Personal firearms and bows are not permitted.
- No alcoholic beverages or illegal substances are allowed on camp property.
- All guests are required to immediately check-in at the designated check-in area. (Please see event instructions)
- **No fireworks** of any kind are permitted on camp property.
- Absolutely **NO** riding around camp in the back of trucks.

Weather/Rain

This is a Rain or Shine event. Please come prepared with additional dry clothes in case the weather is cooler or wetter than you planned. Wearing closed-toed shoes will help not only with the cool weather, but keep your feet safe from the environment, too.

Pets

All pets are to be left at home. Pets of any type are not permitted; including those brought by parents or visitors. Registered service animals are the only animals allowed; please make a note about assistance animals when registering the individual on the website.

Youth Protection Guidelines are very important in keeping everyone safe.

Youth Protection Guidelines

Two-Deep Leadership: Two registered adult leaders or one registered adult leader and a parent of a participant Scout, one of whom must be 21 years of age or older, are required on trips and outings. The chartered organization is responsible for ensuring that sufficient leadership is provided for all activities.

No One-on-One Contact: One-on-one contact between adults and youth members is not permitted. In situations that require a personal conference, such as a Scoutmaster conference, the meeting is to be conducted in view of the other adults and youth.

Respect of Privacy: Adult leaders must respect the privacy of youth members in situations such as changing clothes and taking showers at camp and intrude only to the extent that health and safety requires. Adults must protect their own privacy in similar situations.

Separate Accommodations: When camping, no youth is permitted to sleep in the tent of an adult other than their own parent or guardian. Camp has separate shower and latrine facilities for females, or if separate facilities are not available, times for male and female use are scheduled and posted.



Restroom Facilities:

Most of our restroom facilities are individual stalls and may be used by any age/gender. Those facilities that are not individual stalls will have signage for those who should be allowed in those facilities. We need your help to make sure the separate accommodation is maintained, and we will ensure the proper signage is posted. Please make sure your youth and families are using the correct facilities to adhere to Youth Protection standards.

How should I dress?

- Wear layers of loose-fitting, lightweight, warm clothing, and a hat.
- Mittens, snug at the wrist, are better than gloves.
- Young children should always wear one more layer than an adult would wear.
- Leggings and even close-fitting pajama pants make a great base layer for young children.
- You might want to pack a change of clothes in case your child gets wet.

Tips for Cold Weather

- Don't forget to stay hydrated. Even in winter we can get dehydrated.
- Hot hands are great to help cold hands but please be careful they can burn children if on skin too long. Supervise use.
- Give your kids a 10-minute warning if they develop rosy cheeks, a runny nose, or complain of cold fingers or toes. Remember we have a paramedic on duty in our first aid station if you need a place to warm up your kiddo.

What to expect:



Arrival, Check-In & Parking

- Registration begins at 8:00 am on Saturday morning.
- Check-In will be done in the Camp Staff HQ next to the Emerson Lot.
- Medical forms need to be brought to camp for each person at camp with you, this includes adults and siblings. You may carry them with you but if coming to First Aid area please bring the copy with you. A copy of the health form is available at <https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/ahmr/>.

Vehicles in Camp

- Please follow the parking attendants to the designated parking area.
- No vehicle traffic throughout the camp will be allowed from 9am-4pm. This is to keep our families safe as they travel between program areas.
- Please let the parking attendant know if you need handicap parking and we will make that arrangement for you.
- The camp wide maximum speed is 12 mph; we suggest 3 mph when scouts are present.

Safety Briefing

- The Range Safety Briefing will take place at the beginning of each session at the range. Please make sure your scout attends so they can be briefed on the safety of all shooting sports. If your scout does not attend this briefing, they will not be stamped and will not be able to come onto the ranges until they receive a safety briefing.

Meals

- Meals have been purchased with your ticket.
- Menu has been set as below unless unforeseen supply problems, then menu is subject to change.
- Soup: Cream of Roasted Potato Soup with toppings (cheese, bacon crumbles, chives, diced broccoli), Vegetarian: Vegetable Soup, Alternative: Chicken Noodle
- Sandwiches: Hot Ham & Cheese, Vegetarian: Grilled Cheese
- Dessert: Smores' Cookies
- Hot Cocoa, Hot Coffee and Snow cones will also be available outside during the program.

Identification

- Each camper, adult and visitor must wear camp issued identification (wristband). Camp visitors will be issued identification bands when they arrive at camp. Please make sure to register at Staff HQ.

Trading Post

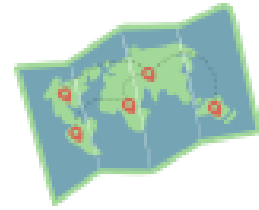
- We will be operating our Cub Family Camping Trading Post throughout the day. It will carry our Cub Family Camping gear (shirts, stickers, etc.) We will also have for sale Hot Hands in case you forgot some.
- Bert Adams Trading Post will be open for you from 8am – 12pm in case some warm items are accidentally left at home.

Smoking

- Bert Adams Scout Camp is a tobacco-free facility. Adults with tobacco habits may only use tobacco in the secluded area fenced behind the dining hall. This includes the use of vapor e-cigarettes, cigars, or chewing tobacco. Use of tobacco in any other area will result in dismissal from the camp property.

Refund Policy

Cub Family Events are Rain or Shine events; therefore, all refund requests must be made in writing to bertadams@atlantabsa.org. Refund request will be considered based upon when the written request was submitted using the following schedule.

- 30+ days prior to the event will receive a full refund
- 15-29 days prior to the event receive a refund of 50% of fees paid
- 14 days or less before an event will not receive a refund
